On April 23, 2017, Alfredo passed away peacefully at his home in Ventura, after twenty-one years of suffering from Parkinson's, and later from Macular Degeneration. He was comforted at the moment of death by a caring hospice nurse and Rose, his loving wife of 56+ years.

Many times over the years, and after the onset of dementia, he would say that he had to go to the airport and take care of his passengers.

He and Rose were blessed with two children, Iris Thot Johnson (and Dan Johnson) of San Jose, and Norman Thot (and Herta Thotne Fuchs) of Ratingen, Germany, and three grandchildren, Gina, Alex, and Samuel. In Sao Paulo, Brazil he leaves behind his brother Bernardo Thot, many nephews and nieces, and grand nephews.
